The American Academy has a broad scheme of scholarships, the number and value of which depend upon funds available through donation.

RULES & REGULATIONS

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

Entrance Exams Academic Achievement Scholarships

The first 10 (ten) pupils in order of academic achievement admitted to Year 1 are awarded an Achievement Scholarship worth €1,000 (One Thousand Euros) each. 8 (eight) Scholarships are given to Greek examination candidates and 2 (two) Scholarships are given to English examination candidates. If any of the recipients do not register at the American Academy, the scholarship is offered to the next in rank.

The pupil ranked overall 1st will also be presented with all of his/her 1st year books.

The Achievement Scholarships are deducted from the Year 1 tuition fees. No monetary equivalent is given under any circumstances.

Academic Achievement Scholarships For Existing Pupils

The top 5 (five) pupils from each year group (based on the weighted year average grade) in Years 1 to 6 are awarded an Academic Achievement Scholarship worth €1,000 (One Thousand Euros) each, subject to their conduct being excellent. If there is a tie in grades, then the maximum amount awarded per year group is €5,000 (Five Thousand Euros) and this amount shall be shared equally amongst the top ranking pupils of each year group.

The Academic Achievement Scholarships are deducted from the following year's tuition fees. All previous amounts owed to the AAAF must be settled before this Scholarship may be awarded. No monetary equivalent is given under any circumstances.

BURSARIES I

- (a) Bursaries are awarded for the following academic year.
- (b) Pupils in years 4, 5 and 6 are eligible.
- (c) Pupils in years 2 and 3 are eligible only if there has been a significant change in their family's financial circumstances after their entrance to the American Academy.
- d) Pupils are eligible to apply for bursaries if the family's yearly gross income does not exceed the following limits:
 - (i) for a family up to 2 (two) dependent children the total family's yearly gross income must not exceed €40,000 (Forty Thousand Euros).
 - (ii) for a family up to 3 (three) dependent children the total family's yearly gross income must not exceed €45,000 (Forty Five Thousand Euros).
 - (iii) for a family up to 4 (four) dependent children the total family's yearly gross income must not exceed €50,000 (Fifty Thousand Euros).
- (e) Applications must be made on the form available from the School Treasury at the Main Office and must

be accompanied by the relevant documents specified. These verifying documents also contribute to the evaluation of each individual application.

(f) The deadline for submission of applications for bursaries is 15th May 2018.

BURSARIES II

Pupils whose families are in need, e.g. pupils facing bereavement or serious health problems, are eligible to apply for bursaries irrespective of their family's financial circumstances. Applications must be made at the School Treasury at the Main Office or with the Principal of the American Academy or the Head of the American Academy Junior School.

1. These rules and regulations are subject to change from time to time at the discretion of the American Academy Scholarship Committee. The American Academy reserves the right to make changes to these rules and regulations without prior notification.

2. All scholarships and awards are made at the sole discretion of the American Academy Scholarship Committee, whose decision is final.

3. All scholarships/bursaries awarded are deducted from pupil's following year's tuition fees.

4. These rules and regulations apply for the academic year 2018 – 2019.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITY SCHOLARSHIPS

The Scholarship Committee will decide on Extra Curriculum Awards and Scholarships.

The Extra Curriculum Activity Scholarships will be as follows:

- A. SPORTS
- B. ARTS
- C. OLYMPIADS

Pupils will be eligible to apply if:

- (a) their conduct in school is excellent, and
- (b) they do not fail in any subject in the current or the previous academic year, and
- (c) their training forms part of their school activities, and
- (d) they are members of the relevant school team for their selected field.
- (e) Pupils achieving international awards may be eligible for an extra – curricular award if their chosen field is one not offered at the American Academy provided they comply with (a) and (b) above.

These rules and regulations apply for the academic year 2018 – 2019.
