## **PTA** petition

As you may be aware, graduates of Private Schools in Cyprus do not currently benefit from the same admissions rights as those from Public Schools. The Pancyprian Federation of Private School Parents and Guardians Association have put together a petition to take to the House of Representatives, the Ministry of Education and the Attorney General asking that Public Universities be allowed to admit students with international examinations including A Levels (without depriving any Public School graduate of a position). Our students have excellent academic qualifications, which are widely recognised internationally and yet are often deprived of the right to study at Public Universities in Cyprus.
